This Committee shall meet quarterly.

Recommend processes for educating the community on animal care and responsible pet ownership. Serve as an advisor to the Tulare County Board of Supervisors on Animal related issues. Make recommendations for promoting public awareness of Animal Services. Recommend policies that enhance services proved by Animal Services. Develop and recommend methods to promote adoption of shelter animals. Develop and recommend methods to decrease the number of animals entering the shelter. Recommend ways to encourage volunteer participation at Animal Services. Make recommendations on strategies, goals and funding resources. Assist in the production of written reports for presentation to the Board of Supervisors. Such other policy advisory matters as requested by the Board of Supervisors or Health and Human Services Agency Director.

## **ASSESSMENT APPEALS BOARD**

This Board consists of five members. All five members attend monthly meetings rotating as a three member voting panel at each meeting. No member of the Board of Supervisors will serve on the Assessment Appeals Board.

A person is not eligible for nomination on the Assessment Appeals Board unless he or she meets one of the following criteria:

### **Eligibility Requirement:**

Has a minimum of five years professional experience in this State as a certified public accountant or public accountant, a licensed real estate broker, an attorney, a property appraiser accredited by a nationally recognized professional organization, or a property appraiser certified by the Office of Real Estate Appraisers.

### **Meets:**

Third Monday of each month in the Board of Supervisors' Chambers January through March and June through December (with the exception of January and February which falls on the fourth Monday and December which falls on the second Monday due to County holidays.

Function and Jurisdiction: To increase after giving notice or to lower upon application individual assessments in order to equalize assessments on the local tax assessment roll; to review, equalize, and adjust penal and escaped assessments on that roll except escaped assessments made pursuant to Revenue and Taxation Code Section 531.1; and to exercise the powers specified in Section 1613 of the Revenue and Taxation Code.

### **COMMUNITY HEALTH CENTER BOARD**

This Board will consist of at least (9) Members and No More than (15) members, who shall be legal residents of Tulare Count. Appointed by the Board of Supervisors. Seven Consumer members will constitute a majority of the Community Health Center Board. Consumer members are served by the Tulare County Federal Qualifies Health Centers (FQHC) or have custodial/legal responsibilities for a direct consumer of services. They will represent individuals being served by the Tulare County FQHC in terms of demographic factors, such as race, ethnicity, sex and economic status. Consumer members should geographically represent at least one from each supervisory district in Tulare County. Two members will represent the health care field, at least one of whom is a physician, preferably a provider of derived from the health care industry. The Director of the Tulare County Health and Human Services Agency will serve to represent the County. One member each, representing a local Social Services Agency and Mental Health Agency. There will also be one member who is a representative of the community’s concern for health care, is willing to assist in developing community support for the program and is selected for his/her expertise in community affairs, local government, finance, legal affairs, and/or other commercial, civic or social concern within the community. The Community member may not be a health care provider. Further information on this board can be found in Resolution No. 95-1119 and Ordinance No. 3135.

Members 4, 5, 6, & 9 – Electors of County, Appointed by the Board of Supervisors, not connected with County Government, except one may be a supervisor appointed by the Board of Supervisors. Member 7 – Safety Member of Association elected by Safety Members. Member 8 – Retired member elected by retired members of association.

Duties of this board are to set policy for operation of the Association, consider applications for disability retirement, and control the investments of assets and authorities all disbursement of Association funds.

## **FLOOD CONTROL DISTRICT**

Membership shall consist of the following: Each Supervisor shall submit a list of two candidates who are freeholders and residents of the unincorporated area of his/her district and the Board of Supervisors shall select from the list four members to be appointed to the Commission. The cities of the City-County Association shall recommend to the Board of Supervisors three candidates who are freeholders and reside in three separate cities of municipal territory of the County, and the candidates if approved by the Board of Supervisors will be appointed the Commission.

Make recommendations as to expenditures of funds derived from ad valorem taxes for flood control and drainage purposes. Recommend priorities for action recognizable or defined flood control projects. Recommend zone of benefit boundaries with technical assistance from district staff. Hold necessary hearings to develop and recommend the establishment of zones of benefit to the Board of Supervisors. Make recommendations with respect to proposed state or federal legislation affecting flood control activities. Perform necessary liaison to be able to make recommendations regarding projects that involve other agencies. Make recommendations as to means of financing projects including proposed assessments or tax rates if financed locally. Hold such hearings as directed by the Board involving flood control or drainage matters and make recommendations for Board action. Interview and recommend to the Board of Supervisors consulting firms to perform studies and prepare plans and specifications for flood control projects when necessary. Act on any other specific matter regarding studies, hearings, legislation, tax rates, etc. as directed by the Board.

## INDEPENDENT AMBULANCE COMPLIANCE COMMITTEE

This Committee consists of five (5) voting members as follows: City Representative—represents the incorporated cities within the County; County Representative—represents the unincorporated areas of the County; Hospital Representative—represents hospitals within the County; County Fire Chief's Association – represents fire/first responders within the County; and an At-Large Representative.

Duties and responsibilities of the Committee are as follows: Review Ambulance Service Provider Agreement (Contract) compliance and performance; Consider and resolve disputes or grievances concerning the Contractor's performance or quality of patient care matters which may arise during the term of the Agreement. Approve the assessment of liquidated damages against the Contractor for infractions and/or failure to meet the standards set forth in the Agreement. Make recommendations to the County, Tulare County Department of Health, and the local EMS Agency regarding adjustments and/or modifications of the terms and conditions of the Agreement which govern Contractor's delivery of ambulance service; Receive regularly scheduled reports regarding the Contractor's performance under the terms and conditions of the Agreement; To periodically submit reports to the Tulare County Board of Supervisors

regarding its observations and recommendations of the Contractor's performance in Tulare County; and, To advise the Tulare County Board of Supervisors, the Tulare County Department of Health, and local EMS Agency on all matters relating to the Provider Agency Agreement performance. The Committee's recommendations provided to the Tulare County Board of Supervisors, the Tulare County Department of Health, and the local EMS Agency shall be non-binding.

### **INDIAN GAMING LOCAL COMMUNITY BENEFIT COMMITTEE**

This Committee consists of nine members. Two representatives from the County selected by the Board of Supervisors; three elected representatives from cities located within four miles of a tribal casino in the County, however, if there are no cities within four miles, other local representatives may be selected upon mutual agreement by the Board of Supervisors and the Tribe; Two representatives selected by the Tribe; One mutually selected alternate; and, one County representative alternate.

Committee is responsible for developing the application policies and procedures for the distribution of grant funding; assessing the applications; and setting reimbursements for county administrative costs.

Function: Legislation, SB621, established the method of calculating the distribution of appropriations from the Indian Gaming Special Distribution Fund for grants to local government agencies impacted by tribal gaming. An Indian Gaming Local Community Benefit Committee is to be created in each county where Indian gaming is conducted.

## MEASURE R CITIZEN'S OVERSIGHT COMMITTEE

Membership shall consist of the following: One member will be appointed by each City and the County (Total of 9). One representative from a major private sector Tulare County employer, nominated by the Tulare County Economic Development Corporation. One representative from the building industry, nominated by the Tulare County Building Industry Association. One representative from the agriculture industry, nominated by the Tulare County Farm Bureau. One representative from the Hispanic community, nominated by the Tulare Kings Hispanic Chamber of Commerce. One representative from an advocacy group representing bicyclists and pedestrians, and/or transit. One member who is a professional in the field of audit, finance and/or budgeting with a minimum of five years in a relevant and senior decision-making position in the public or private sector. One representative from an environmental advocacy group.

The Committee may receive, review and recommend any action or revision to plans, programs, audits or projects that is within the scope of its purpose stated above. Specific responsibilities include receiving, reviewing, inspecting and recommending any action on independent financial and performance audits related to the Measure. Receive, review and recommend action on other periodic reports, studies and plans from responsible agencies. Such reports, studies and plans must be directly related to Measure programs, revenues, or expenditures. Review and comment upon Measure expenditures to ensure that they are consistent with the Expenditure plan. Annually review how sales tax receipts re being spent and publicize the results. Present Committee recommendations, findings, and requests to the public and TCAG in a formal annual report to inform Tulare County residents how funds are being spent. The Committee will have full access to the TCAG independent auditor and will have the authority to request and review specific information, with the understanding that the Committee will rely upon data. Processes and studies available from TCAG, and other relevant data generated by reputable sources. It is understood that TCAG will be continuously striving to improve the reliability of data and to update analytical and modeling processes and that the Committee will be kept abreast of any such efforts, and is invited to participate in development of such updates in a review capacity.

## **TREASURY OVERSIGHT COMMITTEE**

This Committee consists of five members who serve at the pleasure of the Board as follows: The Auditor-Controller; A representative appointed by the Board of Supervisors; The County Superintendent of Schools or his Designee; A representative selected by a majority of the presiding officers of the governing bodies of the school districts and community college districts in the County; A representative selected by a majority of the presiding officers of the legislative bodies of the special districts in the County that are required or authorized to deposit funds in the County Treasury. And, two members of the Public with term endings as follows: One with expertise or an academic background in public finance, the other, according to SB 866, economically diverse and bipartisan in political registration.

Duties are as follow:

**Investment Policy:** In accordance with Government Code Section 27133, the County Treasurer shall annually prepare a County Treasurer’s Investment Policy that will be reviewed and monitored by the County Treasury Oversight Committee.

**Audit of Compliance:** In accordance with Government Code Section 27134, the Tulare County Treasury Oversight Committee shall cause an annual audit to be conducted to determine the county treasury’s compliance with Article 6 of Chapter 5 of Division 2 of Title 3 of the California Government Code. The audit may include issues relating to the structure of the investment portfolio and risk.

The Commission consists of 9 members. The Board of Supervisors shall appoint 1 member from each Supervisorial District; and 3 members At-Large. One member is appointed by Tulare County Association of Governments. Members are appointed to serve a Two-year term. Members shall have knowledge, interest, or experience as determined and desired by the Board of Supervisors in one or more of the following areas: the building industry, community development, conservation and other environmental interests, water rights, water provision and irrigation services, flood control matters, agricultural and dairy industries, or local government, including tribal government.

## **WORKFORCE INVESTMENT BOARD**

This Board consists of 31 members appointed by the Board of Supervisors. The Workforce Investment Act of 1998 and the California Strategic Five-Year Plan of the Workforce Investment Act of 1998 require the creation of a local Tulare County Workforce Investment Board for the purpose of implementing the Workforce Investment Act and to provide strategic planning, policy development, and oversight of local workforce investment activities.

The number of Directors will vary in number from time-to-time according to the number of Public Sector Representatives on the Board since the majority membership must be Private Sector. The number of directors may also vary from time-to-time due to a single person with multiple affiliations representing more than one category, program, group or entity.

The term of each member will be for two years. There will be no limitations on the number of terms any individual may serve on the Board of Directors.
