Precious minutes are wasted when the fire department or other emergency responders cannot find you because the address is not posted on your house, at the road, or at the entrance to your property. Please help us help you by posting your address in 4” numbers placed on contrasting background, at your mail box, the end of your driveway, or on your home if it fronts the road. Your life and the lives of your loved ones are at stake. We can’t help if we cannot find you!

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS:

Are addresses required?

Per Tulare County Ordinance Code, and Section 505 of the 2019 CA Fire Code, all residences, stores, and businesses fronting on any public thoroughfare in the County of Tulare shall install permanently on such premises the address number issued.

Where should addresses be posted?

Your address should be posted on your house, mailbox, or at the end of your driveway, so that it is visible from the street.

What if I have a letter in my address?

If there is more than one house with the same address, then the letter should also be posted.

What is contrasting?

That is when the numbers posted are on a dark background, which makes them stand out.

Do they need to be reflective?

No, but remember that when you dial 911 it may be dark, or it may be foggy and having reflective numbers can be easier to see under those conditions.
