

Computer and Internet Policy

1. Public computers are reserved for researching the law, accessing Library services, and preparing legal documents. The Library reserves the right to impose limitations on the time and manner in which the public computers are used. A user may be asked to leave a computer
 - To ensure equitable access to computer resources for all users;
 - When Library staff determines the computer is not being used to conduct legal research or to draft legal documents.
2. Parents or legal guardians assume responsibility for computer use by children under 18.
3. Library users may not install software, personal disks, flash drives, or other media. Reconfiguration of hardware, software, network, system settings, or installing peripheral devices is prohibited.
4. The Library assumes no liability for any loss, damage, or injury arising from use of the Library's computers.
5. Favorites and Links are listed as a convenience to patrons and do not imply accuracy or the Library's endorsement.
6. The Library assumes no responsibility for the currency or accuracy of information retrieved from the Internet. The Library strongly recommends that all legal information found on the Internet be verified through alternate sources.
7. The Library reserves the right to terminate an internet session at any time.
8. Documents cannot be stored on the computers. All files will be deleted daily. Users may save their work to a CD purchased from the Library for \$3.00.
9. Printing from the computer is \$.25 per page. You are responsible for all pages printed out.
10. Illegal acts involving Library resources may be subject to prosecution by local, state, or federal officials.

Enforcement of the Patron Rules and Library policies will be conducted in a fair and reasonable manner. Library staff and /or courthouse security will intervene to stop prohibited activities and behaviors. Persons who fail to observe these Rules or other Library policies may be asked to leave the Library, privileges may be revoked, or may be subject to arrest or other lawful action.

The Tulare County Board of Law Library Trustees reserves the right to adjust Library rules, policies, and guidelines.
