FAIR Maps Act


- Before adopting a final map, the board shall hold at least four public hearings at which the public is invited to provide input regarding the composition of one or more supervisorial districts.
- The board shall take steps to encourage residents, including those in underrepresented communities and non-English speaking communities, to participate in the redistricting public review process.
- Population equality shall be based on the total population of residents of the city as determined by that census.
- (The council shall adopt council district boundaries that comply with the United States Constitution, the California Constitution, and the federal Voting Rights Act of 1965 (52 U.S.C. Sec. 10301 et seq.).
- To the extent practicable, council districts shall be geographically contiguous.
- To the extent practicable, the geographic integrity of any local neighborhood or local community of interest shall be respected in a manner that minimizes its division. Communities of interest do not include relationships with political parties, incumbents, or political candidates.
- The council shall not adopt council district boundaries for the purpose of favoring or discriminating against a political party.





Summary

- ✤ 2020 Census confirm what is already well known in Tulare County
- ✤ Latino population comprise nearly 2/3^{rds} total county population and majority in 4 districts
- Extensive discussion/collaboration with residents, community leaders from all parts of Tulare County led up to creation of proposed maps
- * Latino CVAP and Voter Registration show 3 majority Voting Rights Act (VAR) districts
- Anticipate that updated figures reallocation of prison population will only strengthen proposed districts
