Dear Supervisors and Mr. Britt:

The Public Works Branch of the Resource Management Agency (RMA) respectfully submits the following report to you to document the progress in the branch for the month of March 2021.

East Orange Avenue Pedestrian Crossing Enhancements Project Complete



In March construction was completed on the East Orange Avenue Pedestrian Crossing Enhancements Project located adjacent to the John J. Doyle Elementary School in Porterville. The Project consisted of the installation of safety improvement features at the midblock pedestrian crossing along East Orange Avenue directly adjacent to the School's entrance and bus drop off areas. The scope of this project included the installation of solar powered rectangular rapid flashing beacons (RRFBs), advance flashing beacons, ADA Ramps, minor paving, and related improvements (signing/striping, etc.). The completion of this project has increased community safety by improving visibility for motorists approaching the pedestrian crossing, providing accommodations for persons with disabilities, and

increasing safety for pedestrians using the crossing. This project was programmed as part of the 2019-2020 CTIP. Funding for the project included HSIP and County Road Funds.

Construction on this project began on February 2nd, and was completed on time and within allotted construction budget by Don Berry Construction Inc. Throughout the course of construction, the contractor worked closely with staff at the adjacent Elementary School to ensure pedestrian and bus traffic was not negatively impacted by construction activities. At this time, County staff is working directly with the contractor to ensure all necessary paperwork has been submitted prior to providing final payment for this work and taking the Notice of Completion for acceptance to the Board. Construction costs were \$104,247.00.

Community Accessibility Enhancement Project

Another project that Public Works completed in March was the Community Accessibility Enhancement Project 2.0. This multi-district project consisted of pedestrian improvements in the Communities of Terra Bella, Ivanhoe, Pixley and Cutler. The scope of the project included the installation of ADA ramps, sidewalk, concrete islands, crosswalk striping and asphalt pave-outs. This Project was awarded to Witbro Inc, dba Seal Rite Paving and Grading. in September of 2020. The contractor began work on the project in late October. The project was placed on temporary suspension at the end of December but resumed and was completed when work resumed in the community of Cutler in March. In addition to the work completed by the contractor, County forces stepped in and installed



Rectangular Rapid Flashing Beacon (RRFB) systems, including pedestrian push buttons and Advanced Warning Beacons in the communities of Pixley and Ivanhoe. The completion of this project has increased community safety by improving visibility for motorists approaching the pedestrian crossing, providing accommodations for persons with disabilities, and increasing safety for pedestrians using the respective crossings. This project was fully funded through County Measure R Local Program Funds. Construction costs for this project were \$407,943; this project was completed within budget. Staff is working with the contractor to complete the final paperwork to present to the Board for final acceptance.





MANAGEMENT GROUP 2:

ASSISTANCE TO ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT/PLANNING PROJECTS

Public Works provided GIS Maps to other branches of the Resource Management Agency. In March 115 maps were provided to the Planners for 24 separate projects.

ENCROACHMENT PERMITS

In March staff processed a total of 34 new encroachment permit applications. The permit processing numbers and inspections continue to remain at high demand levels. County inspectors provided oversight and daily inspections for 11 daily/recurring active projects, and 4 tracts/parcel improvement projects.

Permits Processed:

- Processed and issued a total of 162 transportation permits comprised of: 16 rider permits, 45 single-trip permits (including over-sized or overweight loads) and 101 blanket/annual permits.
- Issued 41 sub-encroachment permits for inspections of job sites under utility company annual/blanket maintenance permits, as well as reviewed sites, signing and safety for dozens of short-term repairs;
- No Special Events are being processed at this time due to COVID-19.

Staff provided inspections and oversight for the following major projects while continuing to provide service to general permits including:

Tract Map-789/Goshen Village Phase 1: Construction of the first phase of the tract along Avenue 310 in Goshen has been completed. The contractor continues to wrap up off-site improvements and residents are beginning to move into the newly constructed homes. The contractor is in the process of beginning Phase II of the project and will continue to be monitored by County inspection staff.

Tract Map-TSM16-002/Kingsburg Hash Subdivision: Phase I of the project has been completed and accepted as complete by County Encroachment inspection staff. With the completion of this work the contractor is slowly continuing work on phase II of the tract development. Since the start of this work the contractor has completed the majority of the utility improvements and is beginning to work on rough grading of the roadways and began installation of the storm drainage system. Our inspectors provided oversight for water main pipelines, sewer and storm drain pipelines, utility trenching including electrical, gas, telecom, and cable services.



Sequoia Gateway: The contractor has recently begun work on the Sequoia Gateway development located south of Avenue 80 near State Route 99. The project has been broken into several phases which are currently planned to contain a hospital, hotel, gas station and several office spaces. At this time the contractor is beginning to work on rough grading of the roadway system within the development. The contractor has additionally started with the installation of the underground work for the storm drain system throughout the development. The contractor completed the sewer crossing at Avenue 280 and will be continuing to work on the frontage of Avenue 280 in the upcoming months.



Pixley Subdivision on Elm: Tract Inspection: 20000002: This is not a new subdivision, but a continuation of a tract map that has been delayed for decades due to community limitations and requirements for sewer. The current contractor has reviewed and evaluated the site and has recently begun working in the area again. To date, the contractor has completed the placement of the curb and gutter and has paved in the roadway throughout the site.

MANAGEMENT GROUP 3:

ZONES OF BENEFIT

Operations and maintenance of Zones of Benefit sewer systems continued with **no spills** in the sewer systems for the month of March 2021.

Operations and maintenance of Zones of Benefit water systems continued through March 2021 with **no known service interruptions or spills.** As previously mentioned, Management Group III terminated the Operations and Maintenance (O&M) Contract with Water Dynamics Inc. An Emergency Purchasing Order was approved for Central Cal Water Works Inc. to temporarily perform the operation and maintenance of the Water and Wastewater Systems. Central Cal Water Works Inc. proceed to perform the operation and maintenance for the remainder of February into March 2021.

It is important to note that the transition to Central Cal Water Works Inc. created deficiencies in data reporting. Therefore, the data presented for the month of February 2021 contains inaccuracies. Staff is working with Management on creating a standardize process for adequate reporting.

The table on the following page summarizes the data available for the water production and wastewater treatment for the month of February 2021. This data is presented on a one-month lag as the data is not submitted to us by our contractor until the 15th of the following month. There is no data for the lift station at El Rancho, as there is no flow totalizer. The readings at the Terra Bella Wastewater Treatment Plant appear irregular and the flow meter will be calibrated.

FLOOD CONTROL

The month of March 2021 passed without any significant storm or flooding events.

On March 4, 2020, Ross Miller, Chief Engineer, and Randy Weatherspoon, Engineer 4, presented to the local chapter of the American Public Works Association on the ToltHawk flood sensor project in the County. The same presentation was also done for the local chapter of the American Society of Civil Engineers on March 18, 2020.

Staff are working with the state and partner agencies to prepare an Emergency Action Plan for Sand Creek Dam, which will define roles and procedures in the event of an incident or emergency related to the dam or Sand Creek.

TRANSIT

TCaT is an essential service and continues to maintain regular service levels through the pandemic. Staff are in frequent contact with our partner transit agencies to discuss and share information regarding the pandemic, including coordinating service and response strategies.

On March 2, 2021 the Board of Supervisors approved the Amendment to the contract with MV Transportation, approving the amendment set into place steps for the move into the Operations and Maintenance facility. MV Transportation is now operating out of the new TOMF facility.

Starting March 1, 2020, TCaT staff began a Free Ride Campaign for youth 7-18. This campaign is being funded by grant from the Low Carbon Transit Operations Program (LCTOP). Children under 7 are already free with a paying adult.

TCaT staff working with CSET staff, provided free rides on March 15th to seniors in the South County unincorporated communities of Tipton, Pixley, Earlimart, and Richgrove to vaccination sites in Alpaugh.

Staff most recently received detailed reports from Caltrans' Cal-ITP program evaluating the quality of GTFS data provided within our county, and TCaT scored perfect or passing in all categories, except two minor details that are being addressed.

The following graph and chart compare this fiscal year's transit ridership to last fiscal year's ridership, both month-to-month, and fiscal-year-to-date. This data has generally been presented on a one-month delay to account for the reporting deadline in the transit services contract. As such, the chart here shows data for February:






Potholes Patched




Shoulder Maintenance (miles)




Traffic Signs
