The Public Works Branch of the Resource Management Agency (RMA) respectfully submits the following report to you to document the progress in the branch for the month of May 2020.

Clean Water Now Flowing in Seville

For the first time in nearly five years the community of Seville has clean tap water due in part to the efforts of the Public Works Division of the County of Tulare. The water system had been on a continuous boil water notice since June 2015, which was rescinded on May 15, 2020 at the direction of the State Water Board Division of Drinking Water. The County became the court-appointed receiver of this water system in 2009 when state regulators and

community activists asked the County to help. The system had fallen into disrepair from a combination of age and insufficient maintenance. Conditions on this system worsened during the 2011-2017 California Drought, where groundwater levels in the area fell and the well was no longer capable of meeting system demands as the distribution system had significant leaks. A new well was installed in 2014 but the system was still not able to provide enough water to meet demand and system losses. At that time, the Yettem-Seville Water System Improvement Project (the Project) was designed, which includes two phases. The first phase is to construct the replacement distribution system in Seville and a tank for fire storage. This project is substantially complete. Staff expect to request that the Board of Supervisors issue the Notice of



Completion in July. Staff are working to transfer operations of the Seville water system to the newly formed Yettem-Seville Community Services District (YSCSD). The County and YSCSD are working on an agreement to transfer the water systems in Yettem and Seville and to establish a partnership to complete the second phase of the Project. The County, working with YSCSD and other stakeholders, has begun a grant application to construct the second phase of the project to add a new well in Yettem and connect both water systems along Avenue 384. This next phase of construction is expected in 2021 or 2022.







ASSISTANCE TO ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT/PLANNING PROJECTS

Public Works provided GIS Maps to other branches of the Resource Management Agency. In May 27 maps were provided to the Planners for 6 separate projects.

ENCROACHMENT PERMITS

In May staff processed a total of 69 new encroachment permit applications. The permit processing numbers and inspections continue to remain at high demand levels. County inspectors provided oversight and daily inspections for 25-30 daily/recurring active projects, and 4 tracts/parcel improvement projects. As the weather allows, many projects in the mountain areas are beginning to resume, with a special focus on updating utility services, including pole replacement and fire tender clearing.

April Permits Processed:

- Processed and issued a total of 66 transportation permits comprised of: 40 rider permits, 14 single-trip permits (including over-sized or overweight loads) and 12 blankets/annual permits. Efficiency of processing of annual permits has been decreased as a result of COVID-19 as adjustments were made to allow staff to work remotely.
- Issued 9 sub-encroachment permits for inspections of job sites under utility company annual/blanket maintenance permits, as well as reviewed sites, signing and safety for dozens of short-term repairs;
- Reviewed routing and issued permits for 2 house structure relocations;
- No Special Events are being processed at this time as a result of COVID-19.

Staff provided inspections and oversight for the following major projects while continuing to provide service to general permits including:


Tract Map-789/Goshen Village Phase 1: Construction of the first phase of the tract along Avenue 310 in Goshen has been is nearing completion and final inspection will be performed by Encroachment inspection staff. The contractor continues to wrap up off-site improvements and residents are beginning to move into the newly constructed homes. Contractor in the process of beginning Phase II of the project and will continue to be monitored by County inspection staff.

Tract Map-TSM16-002/Kingsburg Hash Subdivision: Phase I of the project has been completed and accepted as complete by County Encroachment inspection staff. With the completion of this work the Contractor is slowly continuing work on phase II of the tract development. Since the start of this work the contractor has completed the majority of the utility improvements and is beginning to work on rough grading of the roadways and began installation of storm drainage system. Our inspectors provided oversight for water main pipelines, sewer and storm drain pipelines, utility trenching including electrical, gas, telecom, and cable services.



Sequoia Gateway: The Contractor has recently begun work on the Sequoia Gateway development located south of Avenue 80 near State Route 99. The project has been broken into several phases which and currently planned to contain a hospital, hotel, gas station and several office spaces. At this time the Contractor is beginning to work on rough grading of the roadway system within the development. The contractor has additionally started with the installation of the underground work for the storm drain system throughout the development. Contractor completed the sewer crossing at Ave 280.

Southern California Gas (Road 192 south of Avenue 152, Poplar: Southern California Gas has continued with the installation of a 16-inch, high-pressure gas pipeline on Road 192 from Ave 96 to Ave 152 through the community of Cotton Center and Poplar. There are several specially designed bores to accommodate canals and State Route crossings, as well as a paving agreement to replace new asphalt on that route. This new pipeline is being placed to better serve the south county area specifically, Setton Farms. At this point the majority of the mainline piping has been installed and the Contractor is scheduled to complete the remaining tie-in and crossing work by the end of June.





Pixley Subdivision on Elm: Tract Inspection: 20000002: This is not a new subdivision, but a continuation of a tract map that has been delayed for decades due to community limitations and requirements for sewer. The current contractor has reviewed and evaluated the site and has recent began working in the area again. To date the Contractor has completed the placement of the curb and gutter through the tract and has began preparing the subgrade for roadway work. It is anticipated that all grading and placement of the new roadway section will be completed in the month of May.

MANAGEMENT GROUP 3:

FLOOD CONTROL

Staff are developing a system wide Condition Assessment Protocol to address capacity and mechanical reliability issues for all of the 26 Storm Water Pump Stations in the county. The last full assessment was conducted over 10 years ago and in view of growth in the county, staff thought it should review the entire system. In addition, staff will develop a program to review the condition of all pumps annually and create a new record system for storing and reviewing annual assessments.

The Tolthawk Monitoring System for stream flow is being expanded to more locations and should be completed in the next few months. In addition, the system is being evaluated for use in various ZOB locations to improve response to equipment and operational failures with the goal being reduction in operating cost and improving system reliability.

CENTRAL ROAD YARD WATER SYSTEM

On May14th, the water system serving the Central Road Yard, Transit Operations & Maintenance Facility, and Fire Station 1 was cleared by the State Water Board for drinking water use without restriction. The motor for the fire pump was replaced as well. Minor modifications to the system are ongoing to improve system reliability and efficiency.

ZONES OF BENEFIT

Operations and maintenance of Zones of Benefit sewer systems continued with **no spills** in the sewer systems for the month of May 2020.

Operations and maintenance of Zones of Benefit water systems continued in May 2020 with **no known service interruptions** in all water systems. The Seville Water System's boil water notice was rescinded on May 15th and the system has experienced no service interruptions since.

Staff will be mailing out notices of delinquent account to all water and sewer users with delinquent balances. Users are advised of the payment timeline before sending the delinquent balance into the property tax roll. The Public Hearing for the matter of applying delinquent balances onto property taxes is set to take place on August 4, 2020. In order to follow Governor Newson's Executive Order N-42-20, the County will be offering payment arrangements for those affected by COVID-19.

The table below summarizes the data available for the water production and wastewater treatment for the month of April 2020. There is no data for the lift station at El Rancho, as there is no flow totalizer. The totalizer at Delft Colony Water has been replaced and was placed in service early May. The flow reading at Delft Colony Wastewater Treatment facility treatment is higher than normal. We do anticipate higher treatment flow due to more people staying home due to the Governor's shelter in place order; nonetheless, we have asked the operator to investigate to be certain there was no significant leak or equipment failure.

TRANSIT

During the ongoing COVID-19 outbreak, TCaT is an essential service and continues to maintain regular service levels. As a result of social distancing and other policies, ridership is dropping despite recent ridership growth. Staff have also been in frequent conference calls with all five of the transit agencies in Tulare County to discuss and share information such as strategies to address dropping ridership and other issues during the pandemic. Staff are working with our contractor, MV Transportation, to enact policies to ensure the safety and health of passengers and drivers but, again, have not reduced any services and do not plan to do so at this time. As an additional safety precaution County is having a third-party professional cleaning company to come and disinfect and clean the TCaT fleet on a weekly basis along with the daily cleaning MV is providing.

Staff continue to review submitted vendor quotes for onboard surveillance cameras to install on TCaT fleet, these cameras will be WiFi capable to live stream in any bus on route and down load via WiFi connection. This security improvement is necessary for the safety and security of passengers and drivers and a benefit to the County.

Staff also continue to research and request information from vendors for stand-alone solar powered electronic bus stop schedules to provide real-time bus schedule and bus arrival times for passengers at major transit stops.

The following graph and chart compare this fiscal year's transit ridership to last fiscal year's ridership, both month-to-month, and fiscal-year-to-date. This data has generally been presented on a one-month delay to account for the reporting deadline in the transit services contract. As such, the chart here shows data for April:









Road Stencil (sq. ft.)
