

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### Disadvantaged Communities Infrastructure and Planning Policy Analysis Grant No. 3014-631

1. In 2014 Tulare County applied for and was awarded the grant to:

- foster development of sustainable communities;
- help meet the challenges of adopting land use plans and integrating strategies to transform communities and create long-term prosperity; and
- promote equity, strengthen the economy, protect the environment, and promote healthy, safe communities.
- 2. The project was funded through the Sustainable Growth Council's Sustainable Communities Planning Grant and Incentives (SCPGI) Program under Prop 84 to implement SB 244 (Wolk).
- 3. The final report includes community engagement/outreach, infrastructure analysis based on existing land uses, suggests infrastructure improvements based on community prioritization, and land use changes and zoning changes in these communities, where feasible.



## Community Selection Process – 21

- CALEnviroScreen ranks census tracts in California based on potential exposures to pollutants, adverse environmental conditions, socioeconomic factors and prevalence of certain health conditions.
- 2. Staff identified those communities falling within Tulare County census blocks scoring in the top 10% of statewide scores.
- 3. Housing Element Action Plan 9 and Implementation of the SB 244 Plan.




### **Project Development Stages**

Stage 1: Gather community information through census data, municipal service reviews, working with the local public utility and community service districts, resident surveys and community meetings.

Stage 2: Analyze data, draft the SGC Disadvantaged Communities Infrastructure and Planning Policy Analysis Report and develop the Legacy, Hamlet and Community Plans.

Stage 3: Report back to the communities with draft plan and proposed zoning changes.

Stage 4: Public Hearings at Planning Commission and final adoption by the Board of Supervisors.


